The Main Campus Election Commission of the University Faculty Senate has verified the results of the Spring election of 2005. The ballot contained the names of twenty (20) candidates, of whom nineteen (19) were elected.

In accordance with the policy of the Faculty Senate, the results of the election include the total number of votes each candidate received. Nineteen (19) seats were open for election.

A total of 688 ballots were distributed, of which 233 were received. Of the total 233 ballots received, 5 were not valid because the envelopes lacked the required signature of the voter. The 228 valid ballots represents approximately 33% of the faculty eligible to vote. Of the candidates elected, 12 are currently members of the Senate, 7 will become members.

Notification of the results of the election has been sent to all candidates.
